

The Melting Pot Insight into Division A - Lebanon

If you want to describe Toastmasters in Lebanon by one word, it would be 'Family'. The clubs of Lebanon while maintaining their individuality like to be represented as a family called Toastmasters Lebanon. Three attributes- support, care, and growth are the secret ingredients of our success and development.

Lebanon clubs aim to grow together and support each other, especially during challenges. We, Toastmasters, are one community, one team, one family within Area 1, Division A, and District 105.

Toastmasters was introduced in Lebanon in 2004 by Dr. Walid Nasrallah, Professor of Engineering Management at the American University of Beirut (AUB). He was already a Toastmaster in the United States of America back then. He brought this concept to Lebanon to enable AUB students to develop their leadership and communication skills while studying. He started working initially on the university club with 5-10 members. The first club in Lebanon, 'Speakers and Leaders' was chartered in March 2005. The enthusiastic members wanted to share the benefits and support the community beyond AUB. They started conducting demo meetings and welcoming professionals. Toastmasters Lebanon became official in 2010 once it was registered with the Lebanese government as an NGO.

We now have five active clubs: Speakers and Leaders, Loudspeakers, Pro-toast, Dhad, and Mercury. What is unique about our clubs is the diversity and mix of cultures. Our members belong to

different professional backgrounds, age groups, university majors, and geographical areas. Apart from Lebanese, our clubs cater to people of other nationalities residing in Lebanon. This by itself brings in multiple perspectives and experiences into our clubs and intensifies the quality and content of our education.

The clubs are distributed in different aeographical locations different meeting timings, and each attracts a specific target audience. This helps each club create its own identity within the guidelines set by Toastmasters International and prospective members can easily identify the club most suited to them. For example, Pro-toast and Loudspeakers are for professionals and are located in different geographical locations, Beirut and Zouk District; Speakers and Leaders is designated for AUB students only, Dhad is for members who want to develop their Arabic language and Mercury's membership is open for the whole community.

Strategically, our members have multiple purposes while wanting to enhance their skills and develop their competencies. Some are working on enhancing their careers, others are complimenting their studies to prepare themselves for work after graduation, and still others, are trying to find their calling.

Toastmasters for us is not only about self-development and skills enhancement; it is about creating everlasting friendships. We stay

connected through weekend outinas. dailv calls. personal support, and much more. If I had to reflect on my current friends' list. it starts with a fellow Toastmaster, continues with fellow Toastmasters. and ends with a fellow Toastmaster. Toastmasters Lebanon is a special community in the heart of the country. We make leaders, friends. and family.

The Melting Pot Insight into Division A - Jordan

It started in November 1999 as an idea, initiated by a group of ladies from the Philippines living in Jordan at the time. Elizabeth "Betsy" Segura Krueger, Vicky Ferrer Mustafa, and Linda Dizon, who had been Toastmasters in other countries, decided to spread the concept in Jordan. Initially, they held meetings in their homes, inviting friends and neighbours; however, the first 'Toastmasters Demonstration Meeting', was held at The Amra Hotel in Amman.

As the guests sat through Introductions, Speeches, Topics, and Evaluations, they understood that Toastmasters was a place where they could improve their listening and speaking skills. Jordanians by nature, are friendly. fun-lovina. adventurous. They are eager to learn and like to explore different new things, but above all, they are ever willing to support and help others in achieving their goals.

On March 27th, 2000, ITCJ was chartered; it became the first accredited Toastmasters club in Jordan. Under the guidance of DTM Betsy Kruger, its first president, and TM Vicky Mustafa, the club grew strong. The group was a cohesive multinational one, with many non-Jordanian members. In 2001, the club became part of District 79, and DTM Maysoun Armouti became its first Jordanian President. The responsibility was a joy and a challenge for her, and her team, but they established a solid base for future Execoms. The support TM Betsy extended was unbelievable; she was always there to help,

exemplary in everything. She will always occupy a place in the hearts of all Toastmasters in Jordan.

Toastmasters soon came to be respected in Jordanian society, as a meticulously run educational cultural forum. People also started seeing its use for networking, and Toastmasters' popularity grew.

ITCJ too expanded rapidly. At the point when it had more than 40 active members, it was decided to split ITCJ, to create a second club. DTM Rosemary Bdeir undertook the project of establishing the new club as her High Performance Leadership (HPL) project. With 5 members from ITCJ and 15 new members, the Rainbow Club was chartered as the second Toastmasters club in Amman.

At that time in Jordan, there were several mixed marriages; many foreign ladies were married to expatriates or Jordanian men. The clubs too had a mix of men and women, of which some were couples and many, were singles. Gradually, many more Toastmasters clubs were established. In 2005 and 2011 we even hosted the District Toastmasters Annual Conference (DTAC) in Jordan.

We now have 4 Areas and 16 clubs in Jordan. Although we still have foreigners, the majority are local women and men, because Jordanians spread the word more among their Jordanian social circles. The clubs are varied; there are clubs that meet in the mornings, clubs for women, Arabic clubs, bilingual clubs, and even a French

club. Corporate clubs haven't been successful, due to financial crises and economic challenges. We only have one corporate club at present. Toastmasters in Jordan was an initiative by ladies, and membership expanded through their friends who were ladies too. The number of women Toastmasters has always been higher, and most of them are locals.

Lately, many young professional men and women, who want to become leaders in their fields, are joining Toastmasters. They want to interact with people from different backgrounds, get exposure to different cultures, and enhance their business and social connections.

ITCJ trailblazed its journey carrying with it the glorious distinction of being the first Toastmasters club of Jordan. It was founded by Toastmasters Vicky Ferrer, Linda Dizo, and Elizabeth Kruger in the year 2000, with an impressive member base of 35 in its club roster. Today, two decades later

it boasts of 6 members who are Distinguished Toastmasters and 9 charter members who have stayed with the club for the entire 20 years.

ITCJ believes in consistency and fulfillment of member's needs and achievements. The club has won several laurels in the last 20 years and it rounded off the year 2019 - 2020 with 9 DCP points making it a President's Distinguished Club.

The members meet every two weeks on Monday with an agenda that features the regular segments of a Toastmasters meeting: project speeches, evaluations, table topics, etc, but the club also believes in constantly improvising with new ideas. To add further value to the ongoing learning of Toastmasters the club recently introduced a slot for book reviews. A popular book is discussed and members are encouraged to read it and present their reviews in the following meeting.

Twenty years is a long time! Are you not intrigued to find the reason behind the affinity and long term association of members to the club? It is a heartening fact that members of ITCJ consider themselves to be part of an extended family. Apart from the regular meetings, they celebrate every major occasion and festival together, be it Ramadan, Eid, Christmas, or New Year. Power Couple Together they Lead

A friendly conversation between the Power Couple of Division A and the Newsletter Team.

Immediate Past Division A Director DTM Ruba Afana and her husband DTM Zuhair Mihyar, who was the Treasurer and Club Growth Director of her team, share their experiences of growing together in Toastmasters.

While they disagree on who is funnier, they wholeheartedly agree that Zuhair is a pro at Table Topics, while she is a champion in prepared speeches.

The Beginning

Ruba: Zuhair joined first in 2003. I really hated Toastmasters back then, mainly because he was always in Toastmasters. Later, I found out from my cousin that this was because he was not just a member in almost every club of Jordan, but also a part of every EXCOM! (shaking her head in exasperation)

In 2009, I was faced with a situation at work. At a presentation in front of the Board of Directors I went completely blank. I came home and told Zuhair that I wanted to join Toastmasters, just for a year. I thought I would finish my 10 projects and quit. It's my 12th year now!

What are the challenges of being in the same club?

Ruba: (smiling) No, in fact it's not challenging because we cooperate and back each other up specially when people are reluctant to take up certain roles. We volunteer, make fun of each other in meetings and people love it when we are there. I feel that we bring a little humor to the meetings we attend together.

Mutual Support

Zuhair: (leaning forward) Well my experience helped her in two ways: She is good at crafting her speech but sometimes she finds it difficult to choose the subject. So, I help her find topics for her speeches; at the same time, I encourage her in Table Topics which she hates.

Ruba: For me I don't know. Am I helping you?

Zuhair: (instantly) Yes. Yes. You are my inspiration in the meeting.

Ruba: (smiling) We also give each other evaluations after the meeting, things that the evaluators did not mention.

Zuhair: We do not evaluate to motivate because this is the moment of truth! (laughs)

Zuhair: Sometimes we take EXCOM roles simultaneously; like she the President and I the VPE or the other way around. I am not too good at following up with officers and reports, but she follows up every single thing. I feel our clubs wouldn't be able to achieve President's

Distinguished Club status without her help.

Ruba: (laughs) I nag well. I am a good nagger.

Can you share a fun moment in your journey together?

Zuhair: (smiling broadly) Lots of moments! Here is one. When, I visit clubs and she finds out that there are nice ladies there, she will join us in the next meeting and announce, "He is my husband."

Ruba: (nodding and laughing) Yes, that's true. I like to announce at every meeting that, "I am his wife, so please, watch it."

Toastmasters Achievements that you are proud of

Zuhair: We helped start the Ayla Club and the Al Bayan club. I cannot even think of leaving these 2 clubs because they are my success stories.

Zuhair: We are now sponsoring 2 clubs for which we have worked very hard. They were on hold because of the Covid situation. Within the next month we hope to file their papers. It is a club for the Board of Lecturers at the Middle East University of Jordan.

Leadership styles and Influence on Toastmasters

Ruba: I am a details person. I follow up thoroughly on my team members. This works for me and last year at the division we achieved almost all the goals.

Zuhair: I am goal oriented, not detail oriented. I look at how to achieve. I motivate through humor and encouragement. I focus on the goals.

Ruba: (smiling) I think we make a great combination. To achieve goals, you need someone to follow up on details. What he misses in his leadership, I have and what I miss in my leadership, he has.

Zuhair: We are also known as the couple that injects enthusiasm, humor and all kind of ideas.

Ruba: Yea. We believe that we have a positive impact on people when we join. They believe in us and trust us. They reach out to us not only for Toastmasters issues but for personal matters too. I believe we inspire this trust among people when we show up together.

Do you recommend couples to be part of the same club? Why or why not?

Ruba: For me personally, yes

Zuhair: (thoughtful look) When we have an argument at home and that happens a lot between couples, we encourage each other to attend a Toastmasters meeting. There we cheer for each other and by the end of the meeting we are happy and we forget about the dispute.

Any tips for Toastmaster couples out there?

Zuhair: Seventeen years ago, I wasn't really a good communicator. You know when you are young, you tend to be a little bit stubborn, sometimes getting into arguments. After joining Toastmasters, my personality changed, and today I am a very different person. I am a better communicator with my wife and my children. See, she approves that right now. (smiling)

Ruba: Yes. Yes.

Zuhair: Toastmasters is great for you individually but also for you as a couple. I encourage everyone to have their partners to join together because they would really see the tremendous change in their spouses as they discover their personality.

Power Family Together they Lead

An interview with DTM Vicky Ferrer on the Power family of Division A - DTM Vicky, her children DTM Jennifer Ferrer, TM Hussam Ali and TM Emad Ali.

We have witnessed the ambitious, the high-flyers, the stalwarts in Toastmasters as individuals but it is a rare occurrence to see a family of high achieving Toastmasters inspiring each other to grow.

Now pursuing her DTM for the third time and actively involved in 6 clubs, TM Maria Victoria Ferrer has come a long way. Through this journey, she has also touched the lives of her family who are now actively growing in their own Toastmaster journeys. Dr. Jennifer Ferrer achieved her DTM in July while TM Hussam Ali will receive his DTM in August this year. Emad Ali has achieved his ACS and ALB.

What are the challenges of families being in the same club?

In Jordan my son Hussam, Emad and I are members of SICAP Toastmasters Club. My oldest daughter and I are in the same club in California. I don't see any challenge. On the contrary it is an advantage. We enjoy watching each other and exchange comments about our speeches and roles. I do not interfere with the way my children do their roles. They are not Vicky's children - they have their own identity, talent and skill. I always encourage them to do their best. They always make me feel so proud.

It all depends on the family dynamics. In my case my children do not mind their mother as a member of the same club. I am a "cool" mom too. My children can confide to me anything. I can reach out to all generations and appreciate their language, their way of dealing with

things, etc. I conduct trainings with children, teens and adults.

What is the impact of your Toastmasters journey on your family?

I learned how to communicate with them in a positive and encouraging way. I am proud to say I never had an argument with them. We would discuss issues, accept each other's points and reach a compromise. As they had been witnessing Toastmasters meetings since several years, they were able to pursue their speech projects and roles in exceptional ways.

What kind of adjustments did you make?

I made sure I led a balanced life as a mother, wife, trainer and a Toastmaster. I did everything to the best of my ability. As Toastmasters

Integrity, Service and Excellence; I made sure we practiced the same at home.

How have your leadership roles impacted your family?

I lived in the Middle East for almost 30 years. I know the culture and the language. I had a strong relationship with different communities. The leadership roles were beneficial for me, I had the opportunity to practice my multicultural leadership and communication skills. My children developed the same skills and are able to lead and communicate with people of every nationality with ease.

Something that you couldn't have achieved without your family's support?

I owe my early Toastmasters journey to Hussam Ali who accompanied me to all the Toastmasters meetings Doha. Doha Toastmasters members were mostly men with 2 or 3 women as members. I made a compromise with my husband that my son Hussam will accompany me. Hussam never showed any negative

we live the values of Respect, reaction. He would quietly play with his games. When I won the Lt Gov for Marketing in Jordan in District 20. I thanked him for all that he had done for me.

Share a memorable leadership moment.

Ensuring different communities in Toastmasters worked together was a challenge. I endorsed the Arabic Committee in my term so that they can be active and contribute to District 20. The Arabic community (among the other communities) supported me all throughout my leadership.

The satisfying bit was when I reached out to ask for support from any Toastmaster, he/she would always say, "How can I say no to you Vicky? You were always there to help and assist me".

Share a humorous moment.

We held the chartering ceremony of a Filipino Club in Doha called Filcom Toastmasters Club. When we invited the Philippine Ambassador on stage, I realized we did not have a Toastmasters pin for the Ambassador. I asked our SAA

to look for one. He happily came back and handed me a pin...a safety pin! I quietly took my Toastmasters pin off stage and handed it to the Ambassador.

Any tips for Toastmaster families out there?

Enjoy each moment with your family members. Always be motivating and be their first cheerleader. Let them be themselves and discover their own identity.

This club was once just a dream, a vision, a concept in the heart of one single lady. I was one of the first Toastmasters she approached with her proposal to start a Toastmasters Club for French speakers in Jordan. There were various French discussion groups and book clubs, but none possessed the aura of Toastmasters.

I was then a new and starry-eyed member of Stars Toastmasters club in Amman, not keen on wandering away from my newly discovered comfort zone. Still, TM Bernadette Jebaili appeared at every meeting of my club, listened to my speeches, and gently persuaded me to 'create a little history by bringing together scattered French knowledge under one roof'. I was soon inspired by her passion to dust off our rolling R's and practice the language of Molière and Sagan.

We used the proverbial candle to unearth other willing souls interested in a French Toastmasters club. What united us was our love for the language, what scared us was the rustiness we felt at not having used this beautiful language for years. Slowly, we gathered enough brave souls to hold meetings, and to hear the language of love being croaked out in the coziest of atmospheres amidst the common inadequacy of forgotten words. What drew some of us at the time were the delicious homemade desserts that each of us brought to the meeting in turns, (most times by Bernadette), and of course the pioneering feeling of embarking on something new, something worthwhile. The Toastmaster spirit helped us infuse our meetings with basic and solid building blocks of communication, camaraderie, and support.

Our numbers fluctuated between 8 and 20 depending on the degree of courage we could muster to speak to an audience in a language that was not native to any of us.

Gradually, our presentations improved and so did our confidence in our abilities and our Club. We were ready to charter the first French club of District 105. We explored names ranging from 'Desert Rose' to 'Paris/Amman', and "Jordanian Orators' to 'Petra', but when a member came up with "La Vie en Rose", we knew we had found the winning name. It was uplifting, unique, and truly French! (vie= life, rose= flush/pink roughly translates to Life at its best) That was six years ago. Today La

Vie en Rose is a vibrant, dynamic Club with 29 members that holds its own among the best Toastmasters clubs. It was not easy getting here. We faced fluctuating membership and several other challenges, but our passion remained unwavering. The benefits of improving our language and leadership skills were tremendous. Today we have speeches, evaluations, workshops, educational sessions, naturally all in French, and annually we showcase the Club and its uniqueness by presenting a speech in French at the International Speech Contest at Area and Division levels.

We have no rivals as yet but if and when that happens, La Vie en Rose remains the first French club to reign 'à la mode' with a 'je ne sais quoi' flair!

My article will be amiss if I do not mention TM Laila Sweis, Immediate Past President this year, whose selfless contribution to La Vie en Rose has helped the club shine and excel in the best tradition of Toastmasters.



Club to Community Leading the way

DTM Areej is a partner in a subtitling company and a philanthropist who has a passion for public speaking.



Passionate about speaking and adept at leading she took the core values of Toastmasters beyond the confines of a club to create an impact in the community with her HPL project.

Many people assume that, because Jordan is in the Middle East, it doesn't get cold; when in reality Jordan's winters are very fierce. Though you and I may have the means to stay warm, many families dread the winter months.

I involve myself in different kinds of charity work all year round to help those in need because I strongly believe that every little bit counts. This thought helped me select my High Performance Leadership project. In October 2019, I launched a "Winter is Coming!" fundraising campaign to provide essentials to as many needy families as possible.

I formed a team with eight likeminded ladies, to handle different aspects of this huge endeavor. The first action was to delegate and assign roles to different team members for donation collection, price negotiation, campaign promotion, and aid distribution.

We announced and promoted the campaign using both Facebook and Whatsapp and asked our friends and families to share our posts as well.

We identified the families in need by visiting them and cross-checking



with the relevant government institutions responsible for that section of society. It was then necessary to compile a list of what each family required.

After negotiating to get the best prices for the required items, so that we could get more for less without compromising on quality, we purchased the items. The response and support we got from the community were overwhelming. We received donations both in money and kind.

We collected 6791 JDs (around \$9578) with which we bought heaters, gas cylinders, kerosene, blankets, jackets, and shoes to help over 200 families, spread all over the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan. 
